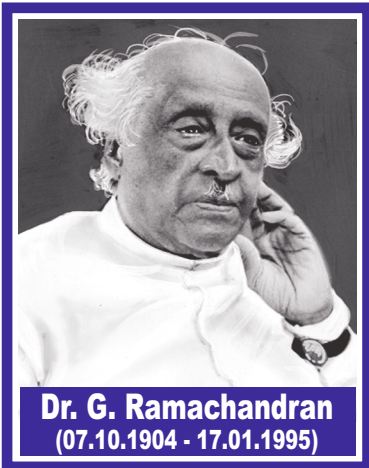

GENESIS OF GRI

Gandhigram has its genesis on 7th October, 1947. It progressed and expanded remarkably in the areas of community development under the dynamic leadership of its founders Dr.G.Ramachandran and Dr.T.S.Soundram, dedicated disciples of Gandhiji. Drawing huge inspirations from the ideas of Mahatma Gandhi, they worked with enormous amount of zeal and commitment for the betterment of the rural people in the vicinity and it was their unstinting dedication and unwavering faith in Gandhian ideals that has made Gandhigram what it is today.

'Gandhigram' was inaugurated by the Father of our Nation Mahatma Gandhi on 7th October 1947 with a powerful message "Success Attends where Truth Reigns". Since then, Gandhigram has been a hub of community development.

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) of Higher Education was started in 1956 to bring higher education closer to the villagers. The significant educational experiment, broadly conforming to the recommendations of the Radhakrishnan Commission relating to rural universities and rural colleges, was inaugurated by Dr.R.Rajendra Prasad, the then President of India on August 1956. The first academic block of the Institute was opened by the former Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru on December, 1957. Right from its inception, the Institute is fully-funded by Ministry of Education (the then Ministry of Human Resource Development), Government of India, New Delhi.

- The Institute is situated at a serene and verdant campus environment spreading over 207 acres of land, and most of these lands were donated by the villagers voluntarily for the noble cause of offering higher education to the rural youth and to promote their employment opportunities.
- GRI was one among eleven rural institutes established by the Ministry of Education. The GRI **remains alive and vibrant, rendering yeoman service to students and village communities.**

- The most important educational experiment of Gandhigram is the system of education envisaged by Gandhiji in the form of '*Nai Talim*' which is founded on the ideal providing basic education to the rural people is a basic requirement for rural development. The Institute has been fostering innovations in extension and rural development activities and as a result has been credited with praiseworthy best practices.
- The Institute has grown by leaps and bounds and it was conferred the status of Deemed to be University in the year 1976 by the then Ministry of Social Welfare and Education (now Ministry of Education, GoI).
- Honourable Presidents of India Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Shri Venkatraman, Shri S.D.Sharma, Shri K. R. Narayanan, Shri Abdul Kalam, Honourable Vice-Presidents of India Shri Hamid Ansari, Shri Venkaiah Naidu, Honorable Prime Ministers of India Shri Jawaharlal Nehru, Smt. Indira Gandhi, Morarji Desai, Shri Rajiv Gandhi, Shri Narendra Modi, Governors of Tamil Nadu Shri. Panwarilal Purohit, Shri R.N.Ravi, Honourable Chief Ministers of Tamil Nadu Shri C.Subramaniam, Shri K.Kamaraj, Dr. M. G. Ramachandran, Shri M.K.Stalin, Honourable Ministers of Education Sri. Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank, Shri. Dharmendra Pradhan, Union MoS for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying; and Information and Broadcasting Shri L.Murugan and many noted freedom fighters, national leaders and international figures including Khan Afar Khan, Martin Luther King Jr. have visited the Institute at different points of time.
- Dr. KM. Annamalai, a renowned Physiotherapist and a Social Activist has assumed office as the Chancellor on 20th April 2017.
- Dr. N. Panchanatham, an eminent academician and former Vice-Chancellor of Tamil Nadu Teacher Education University, has assumed charge as the Vice-Chancellor of Gandhigram Rural Institute on 02.06.2024.

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI), founded by two dedicated disciples and contemporaries of Mahatma Gandhi, beloved 'Mama' Dr.G.Ramachandran and beloved 'Amma' Dr.T.S.Soundram, has its foundation in Mahatma Gandhi's revolutionary philosophy of *Nai Talim*, which effectively bridges the cognitive and practical dimensions, and focuses on the holistic development of learners, with an emphasis on skill development through value-based education, rooted in indigenous cultures and traditions. Since its establishment in 1956, GRI has been unstintingly contributing to higher education and has successfully pioneered rural higher education.

The Institute functions under the Ministry of Education, Government of India and is fully funded through UGC, New Delhi. The Institute has designed academic programs in Rural Development, Gandhian Studies and Peace, Rural Oriented Sciences, Co-operation, Development Administration, Sociology, English, Tamil and Indian Languages. It runs B.Tech. in Civil Engineering and M.Tech. in Renewable Energy. It also offers B.Sc Agriculture and many B.Voc programs.

GRI is quite active on both campus and rural areas in the vicinity, benefitting and enriching one another. Besides, its contribution to teaching, from diploma, degree and all the way to post-doctoral levels, the Institute applies the learnings from both scientific and social research to solve contemporary rural problems. The curriculum is a combination of theoretical, practical and extension experiments. The Institute has become home to many pioneering models of rural development programmes. The students and scholars who emerge from its portals tend to meet the personnel needs of rural development programmes under various Governmental and Non-Governmental Organizations.

The three dimensional approach of education namely teaching, research and extension has become a highly celebrated model, earning global and nationwide appreciation. Started in a small way, the Institute has evolved into a reasonably large and expansive educational complex comprising of 8 Schools, 19 Departments and 9 Centres offering a whopping 61 academic programs, ranging from Certificate courses to

Graduate programmes, Doctoral, Post-Doctoral Programmes. At present the Institute has around 4000 students, including Ph.D. Scholars, with a sanctioned strength of 185 teaching and 227 non-teaching staff.

The curricular model, developed at GRI originally integrating teaching, research and extension, has earned the Institute, the status of Deemed to be University in 1976 by UGC, the Five-star status by NAAC in 2002, 'A' Grade during the re-accreditation in 2010 by NAAC and again 'A' Grade in its third cycle of accreditation in the year 2016, 'A++' Grade in its fourth cycle of accreditation in the year 2025 by NAAC.

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) has adopted the National Education Policy 2020 for the programmes offered by it. With this the institute offers four year under graduate programmes with a provision to exit at any level and entry at any level. For example, a student who completes all the courses of the first semester and exits at the end of the first year will be given a Certificate. A person who leaves after completing the requirements after two years will be given a Diploma while the ones who leave after 3 years will get a degree. After four years of study the student will get a Honours degree. In case of students undergoing B.Sc programme in Chemistry it will be a Certificate in Chemistry, a Diploma in Chemistry, B.Sc(Chemistry) and B.Sc (Honours- Chemistry). In the process a student who exits the programme midway through can seek readmission at the appropriate level. In due course, the institute will offer both a two year PG degree (for those who have undergone a three year UG programme) and a one year PG degree programme (for those who earned a Honours degree). Students are given enough opportunities to pursue the programme at their own pace and of their interest. The NEP 2020 provides lot of scope for skill improvement and employability aspects. It includes value added courses, internships and field study as part of the curriculum. GRI has village placement programme (VPP) as a component of the curriculum for all the UG and PG students to facilitate them to learn the problems faced by the rural populace and understand where they can intervene and facilitate them to get out of the problems.

The salient features are flexible curriculum and liberty for a student to take credits (learn from a variety of institutions

and online portals like MOOC, NPTEL etc) through other means and earn a degree. Every student of GRI has to enroll with the National Academic Depository (NAD) and the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). The student will be given a unique id and this will be his/her id. The credits earned by a candidate by undergoing courses in different institutions will be submitted by those institutions to the ABC and will be credited to the student. When a student earns enough credits to earn a degree (120 credits to earn a BA/BSc degree), the institute will award a degree. The credits earned by a student will be available in his/her credit for seven years, hence it is mandatory that a student completes a programme in seven years.

The Institute has been taking efforts to design its academic programs in tune with the demands of the society and industry by providing a learner-centric, transparent teaching and evaluation methods. Through the action-oriented research and scientific research, the Institute contributes substantially to the research domains and concentrates on solving the rural issues at micro levels. The participatory and decentralized governance of Gandhigram Rural Institute strives for achieving global standard of excellence in all the dimensions of education without compromising on its rural character and Gandhian values.

Deen Dayal Upadhyay – Kaushal Kendra (DDU-KK) was established as a centre for imparting skill based education as a special initiative of University Grants Commission, New Delhi in 2014-15. There are eight B.Voc. programmes and three Diploma programmes under DDU-KK. These programmes groom students for employment ready status and all the passed out students have got right employment in the nearby industries in Tamil Nadu. The programmes are run with industrial partners through Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) and other linkages.

Objectives

The objectives of the Institute are:

1. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as will promote a classless and casteless society;
2. To provide for research and advancement and dissemination of knowledge; and

- 3 To function as a centre for extension work leading to integrated rural development.

Campus

The Gandhigram Rural Institute is spread over 207 acres in a rural setting, nestling in one of the enclaves of the beautiful Sirumalai range. To its west is a chain of mountains including the beautiful Kodai Hill. Lying north of Madurai, Gandhigram is easily accessible by rail and road. The climate of the place is pleasant all through the year and the panorama of nature surrounding Gandhigram is pleasing and inspiring.

The nearest railway station is at Ambathurai, the nearest railway junction is at Dindigul and the nearest city is Dindigul. The nearest airport is at Madurai.

Thus, in true Gandhian spirit, the institute is committed to promoting communal harmony and humane governance and inclusive rural development. It aims at striking a balance between the old values of simple and spiritual life that are worth retaining and the new ones tempered with modernity, rationality and science. Fortified with these values, the Institute aspires to groom and prepare the student community for harnessing the promising opportunities of and for facing newer challenges of the 21st - century.

The activities detailed in this section exemplify the spirit mentioned above. These activities are unique to GRI and have the potential to be regarded as “Best Practices” of GRI.

Daily Prayer

All working days of the Institute (except during End Semester Exam period) begin with the congregation of students and staff members at Bell Maidan, to join morning prayer at 9.20 a.m. Such congregation has a refreshing and renewing effect on the minds and hearts of those gathered under the canopy of the vast peepal tree. The prayer begins with a spiritual song meant for each day of the week, followed by a reading of an evocative 'thought for the day'. Significantly, the prayer songs and recital of inspirational quotes from eminent thinkers are performed by students of different Departments that are designated, on a rolling basis, to organize the Daily Prayer for one week in every semester. This develops artistic, public speaking and organizational skills in the students.

The occasion of the prayer is also used for making important announcements, felicitating academic/sports achievers and introducing renowned guests/visitors who visit the Institute and choose to participate in the morning prayer. The Daily Prayer, by bringing students and staff together, personalizes the relationship between students and staff as well as among students of different programmes, even, as it reaffirms a sense of belonging to GRI in them.

Inter-Religious Prayer

Inter-Religious Prayer and Inter-Faith Dialogue are the cherished ideas of Gandhiji to promote communal harmony and

peaceful co-existence. Deeply inspired by this ideology, Gandhigram Rural Institute encourages the assembly of all its staff and students on all working Fridays at 4.00 pm, in the hallowed Multipurpose Auditorium for Inter-Religious Prayer, organized and managed entirely by the students of the Institute. This solemn activity involves singing devotional songs of all major faiths, alternated by recital of selected verses from Bhagavat Gita, Holy Quran and Holy Bible. Religious leaders are periodically invited to deliver talks and lectures to promote inter-religious faith and understanding. What had begun as a prayer programme, has, over a period of time, evolved into a GRI community get-together, to share and brief the GRI activities to one another. Hence, latter half of the programme is devoted to informing the significant happenings and notable achievements of the different Departments of the Institute in the form of a news compilation called 'GRI Valam' (GRI Round-up).

Shramdhan

The Gandhian concept of *Nai Talim* (Basic education) is built on the foundational idea that knowledge and work (understood as physical labour) are originally linked and derive their essence from one another. Shramdhan (Serving by labouring) is a Gandhian way of celebrating physical labour. Right from its inception GRI has accorded Shramdhan a pride of place in its corporate life as well as in its curriculum. Every week, an hour's time of class work is set aside for Shramdhan activities in the time-table of all Diploma, UG, and PG programmes. During this hour, all students, scholars and staff enthusiastically and collectively engage themselves in cleaning of class rooms, offices, laboratories as well as the surrounding areas of the Departments. Besides undertaking cleaning work, tree planting and the gardening, landscaping works are also taken up by them on days of national and international importance such as World Environment Day, World Earth Day, and the like. Shramdhan activities invariably generate deep respect for physical work in the minds of students and staff, in a society that tends to unjustly place higher value in mental work. In recent years the central Government's 'Swachh Bharath Mission' has given a new flip to the Shramdhan activities in GRI.

Gurukula System

Gurukula (Mentoring) system is as old as Gandhigram

Rural Institute and is part of GRI ever since its inception in 1956. It is an age old system under the traditional educational world and it was operated in Gandhigram. Further, the system has been continuing even after the declaration of the Deemed to be University status in the year 1976. All the teachers and students, known as Gurus and Shishyas were soaked under the Gurukula System. Every Guru is made responsible for building and moulding the character of the individual student with a view to uproot one of the social sins, “education without character” as identified by Mahatma Gandhi. However, the total personality of the students is shaped by Gurus under the educational system evolved by the founders of Gandhigram Dr.T.S.Soundram and Dr.G.Ramachandran - the founder Vice-Chancellor of Gandhigram Rural Institute. It is envisaged that all-round development of the students in the Institute can take place through the Gurukula system. Such a system will no doubt shape the personality of the future generations. The GRI is following old system with some modifications based on its past experiments and experiences.

Every year, the students admitted in Under Graduate and Post-Graduate programmes are allotted Gurus. The number of shishyas allotted to each teacher is arrived at by dividing the total number of students in a class by the number of Gurus (Faculty Members) available in the concerned Department. The allotment is done fairly through a lot system to avoid arbitrary selections of shishyas. They meet the Gurus at the designated time (decided by each department and incorporated into the weekly time table) each week to discuss their progress in studies, difficulties faced and other personal, interpersonal and career issues. These gurus also serve as their course advisor, career counsellor and well-wisher.

Shanti Sena

Shanti Sena, (Peace Brigade) in GRI was founded in 1958, eighteen years before becoming a Deemed to be University. Since, GRI has always been a testing ground for many Gandhian experiments, the founding father, Dr. G. Ramachandran took upon himself the task of establishing within this institution of higher education a Shanti Sena, an alternative to military training. Even when GRI, upon becoming a Deemed to be University, was presented with the choice to adopt National Cadet Corps (NCC), it chose to continue with Shanti Sena instead. By doing it, GRI became the only educational institution in the whole of globe to have adopted this model.

Combining spiritual, physical, intellectual, and organizational training, the Shanti Sena prepared students for conflict resolution, security functions, disaster relief, and cooperative community service in response to community needs. The approach is always to work together with villagers to improve such things as childcare, sanitation, housing, and preservation of folk arts traditions. The Shanti Sena in GRI until recently assumed responsibility for campus security. No armed police is permitted on GRI campus or if permitted they used to play second fiddle to Shanti Sena, even during visits by Presidents of India, Prime Ministers and other dignitaries. Besides providing security, when such dignitaries and prominent leaders visit the GRI campus, Shanti Sena remains at the forefront in according them floral tributes and grand welcome.

The decades long experience of Shanti Sena in GRI includes taking initiatives in peace building, promoting democracy and governance by conducting peace dialogues, inter-religious dialogues, youth exchange programmes, youth camps, leadership training programmes, sports for peace programmes and prohibition (abolition of arrack) in the neighbouring villages. They are actively involved in emergency relief, peace education, environmental conservation and providing community based health facilities in the rural areas nearby. From the academic year 2018-19 Shanti Sena has become the part of the UG curriculum.

Yoga

This is introduced as a compulsory course for all students who have been admitted from the academic year 2015-16.

Gandhian Principles and Ideologies

Students of this Institute study Gandhian life and Experiments. Gandhian Ideologies, Gandhian Economics and Gandhian Constructive Programmes are incorporated in the curriculum. This enables them to develop tolerance and other ethical and moral values.

Village Placement Programme

All the students of the Institute are placed in the neighbouring villages for a period of seven days. During their stay, the students understand rural environment, undertake household surveys, and prepare reports for development activities. They conduct medical and health care and literacy campaigns. The students undertake Shramdhan activities every day during their stay in the villages.

Promotion of Khadi

Students and staff are encouraged to wear khadi dress. Beside, Khadi shawls are used to honour guests in the university functions. Traditionally, the graduates, Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor and members of academic bodies wear khadi shawls and caps in the annual convocation event.

Opportunities to Learn Additional Languages

A Language Lab and Studio, attached to School of English and Foreign Languages, offer opportunities to learn a new language. Specialized Instructors take care of training and teaching students. This enhances students' skills in communication and soft skills.

Special Training for Communication and other Soft Skills

Special training on Spoken and writing skills' for students is extended from all disciplines. This is part of the syllabus carrying 2 credits. UGC has recommended the same for both UG and PG students.

Community Engagement

All UG students has to study a Course on Community Engagement. This enables them to understand the rural life and approaches to be followed to contact them.

Dr. T.S. Soundaram Health Centre

Dr. T.S. Soundaram Ramachandran (1904–1984), co-founder of Gandhigram Institutions, including GRI-DU, was a renowned physician, social reformer, and champion of Gandhian ideals. An alumna of Lady Hardinge Medical College, New Delhi, she established a two-bedded clinic in 1947, which later grew into the 220-bedded Kasturba Hospital at Chinnalapatti, serving the healthcare needs of the region.

Before 2016, healthcare services for GRI-DU students and staff were provided through Kasturba Hospital, with limited on-campus nursing support. Recognizing the need for a dedicated healthcare facility, a full-fledged Dr. T.S. Soundaram Health Centre was established on the GRI campus on 1 August 2016 under the leadership of Prof. Dr. S. Natarajan, Vice-Chancellor. The Centre provides non-medico-legal primary healthcare services to the GRI community, GRI-adopted Balwadi villages, and the general public.

Four-Year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP)

As envisaged in NEP 2020 FourYear Integrated Teacher Education Programme, a dual-major holistic bachelor's degree in Education rolled out nationwide from 2023-2024 onwards with the nomenclature Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP). Department of Education, Gandhigram Rural Institute is sanctioned with ITEP Secondary Stage, Science Stream from the academic year 2026- 2027 onwards. The program title is Bachelor of Science (Physics/Chemistry/Mathematics) and Bachelor of Education. The Rules and regulations of Choice Based Credit System of the Gandhigram Rural Institute apply to this programme. This tertiary level programmes are a link between secondary education and post graduate level education. The programme aims at integrating general studies comprising Science and Professional studies. It includes foundations of education, content cum pedagogy of school subjects and practicum related to the tasks and functions of a secondary school teacher. It maintains a balance between theory and practice, and coherence and integration among the components of the programme. The course also ensures opportunities for higher learning of the students. The syllabus is designed in eight semesters. B.Sc.B.Ed., is offered in Physics/Chemistry/Mathematics under the umbrella of Sciences and Teacher Education.

On completion of the program, the student teacher will develop competencies and skills needed to become an effective Science teacher at secondary level. They will also develop insight into the meaning, nature, objectives and scope of Physical science education at secondary level. They will acquire logical thinking and pedagogical understanding at secondary level. They will protect of human rights and the rights of the child

Bharathiyar Chair

Bharathiyar Chair was established in 1982 by the Government of Tamil Nadu on the eve of Bharathiyar Birth Centenary Year to propagate his ideals among students and conduct Research on Bharathiar.

The Bharathiyar Chair regularly celebrates his Birthday and observes his Memorial Day and also organizes Literary Competitions by involving the students. The Chair organizes Study Tour Programme to Ettayapuram the birth place of Bharathiyar and nearby historical places for the M.A. Tamil and Indian Literature Students. It organized many National Seminars and

Workshops on Bharathi's Works and published more than five research books.

Further, the Bharathiyar Museum, which contains the Visual Biography of Bharathi, was established by this Chair on 15.08.2016. The GRI Students and other College/School students regularly visit this Museum. Prof.S.Pothireddy Memorial Bharathiyar Research Library was also established on 14th September 2022 by this Chair. This Library has many rare books on Bharathiyar Research.

NSS

The NSS in Gandhigram Rural Institute – Deemed to be University (GRI) has organized several programmes to tune the personality of the student volunteers and make them responsible for rural development since 1979-80. The unique feature of NSS in GRI is that all the students studying Diploma, Under Graduate, and Post Graduate (except one year programmes) are NSS volunteers. There are 19 NSS units in the GRI NSS Cell, coordinated by one Programme Coordinator and supported by 19 Programme Officers. Shramadhan, tree plantation in campus and in the adopted villages, and blood donation to the people admitted in the Kasturba Hospital, Gandhigram, and Government Hospital, Dindigul, are regular features. Other important Regular Programmes organized were AIDS Awareness, Awareness Rallies on Consumer Rights, Save Oil & Gas for Better Living in association with Petroleum Conservation Research Association, Health and Hygiene, Encouragement to NSS volunteers to participate in state level programmes and other programmes for a wholesome personality development of the volunteers. Apart from the above, the Tamil Nadu State AIDS Control Society sponsored three units of Red Ribbon Clubs (RRC) which are also functioning in GRI for the promotion of health awareness among the volunteers. Though B.Ed. programme is not covered under NSS, a separate RRC unit is created for this programme. For the successful organization of the NSS Regular and Special Camping programmes necessary support is enlisted from village Youth Clubs, SHGs, Gram Panchayats, District Administration, Rotary Clubs, leading NGOs, Tamil Nadu State NSS Cell, NSS Regional Office, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports-Government of India, Tamil Nadu State AIDS Control Society, Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Protection Department-Government of Tamil Nadu, and Petroleum Conservation and Research Association (PCRA).

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. The authorities may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct of students within the campus and outside.
2. The authorities have full powers to inflict anyone or more of the following punishments, namely, fine, suspension and expulsion in the interest of the students of the University.
3. Students should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.
4. Students are prohibited from defacing or damaging any building or furniture or any asset or property of the University in any way. The cost of any damage so caused will be recovered from the students collectively if responsibility for it cannot be fixed on any individual(s).
5. Students should not arrange any function or meeting within the University campus without the special permission of the appropriate authorities.
6. Students are strictly prohibited from taking out any procession without the official permission of the authorities.
7. Smoking and consuming alcohol are strictly prohibited.
- 8 **Any student reported to have indulged in any form of ragging will be summarily expelled from the Institute without any inquiry.**
9. **Wearing of ID card is mandatory.** All students should wear their ID cards inside campus. Hostellers have to wear their ID cards while they go to their mess also to avoid unlawful entry of outsiders into dining hall.
10. Entry of students into the campus without ID card will not be

permitted. Those students coming without ID card will be sent out of the campus at the entry point itself.

11. Girls staying in hostels also have to wear ID cards when they go out of the hostel.

12. **Formal dress** should be worn by all students.

13. Hostel inmates are advised to follow the manual approved by Board of Management for the rules and regulations.

Anti Ragging

The Institute in order to curb the menace of Ragging has constituted Anti-Ragging Standing Committee, Anti-Ragging squad, and Anti-Ragging Monitoring Cell. It has also installed CCTV cameras at vital points. The institute updated the above details in the website with nodal officers' complete details. The designated officers are empowered to have regular monitoring and counselling of the students.

Students in distress due to ragging related incidents can call the National Anti-Ragging Helpline 1800-180-5522 (24x7 Toll Free) or e-mail the Anti-Ragging Helpline at helpline@antiragging.in for any other information regarding ragging the students may visit the UGC website i.e. www.ugc.gov.in & www.antiragging.in and contact UGC monitoring agency i.e. Centre for Youth (C4Y) on mobile no. 09818044577 (only in case of emergency).

Admission and Withdrawal

1. All candidates for admission must present their original certificates in the prescribed form obtained from the school or college which they last attended.
2. Students admitted irrespective of the date of their admission must pay the fees for the whole semester.
3. A student who leaves the University in the middle of a semester/year cannot claim remission of semester fees or any other fees for the rest of the semester/year, as a matter of right.

Refund of fees is to be done as per the UGC guidelines

(i) In case an admitted student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the Institution shall refund fees as per the procedure mentioned hereunder:

Percentage of refund of fees	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received.
100%	15 days or more before the last date of admission
90%	Less than 15 days before the last date of admission
80%	15 days or less after the last date of admission
50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days, after the last date of admission
00%	More than 30 days after the last date of admission

(ii) If a student joins the Institution, and then leaves it in mid-session then the entire fees collected shall be forfeited.

LEAVE

1. Application for leave of absence shall be addressed to the HoD concerned. It must also be countersigned, in the case of day scholars, by the Guru and, in the case of hostel inmates, by the Resident Warden and the Guru.

2. Where illness is the ground of application for leave, a medical certificate should accompany the application.
3. All leave applications shall normally be submitted well in advance after availing leave on medical grounds and, where this is not possible, at least by 9.00 a.m. on the day of absence. Where the absence is due to sudden and unforeseen causes, the application for leave shall be made as early as possible. Where the student is incapacitated by serious illness, the parent or guardian is expected to apply for leave on his/her behalf.
4. The University reserves the right to strike off the name of any student from the rolls if he/she is absent for a prolonged period without furnishing satisfactory reason, though he/she may have the necessary minimum attendance to earn the attendance certificate.
5. A student who has been newly admitted to the University and has paid his/her fees but has not begun attending classes is liable to have his admission cancelled and his seat allotted to another if he/she has not applied for leave within a week of the commencement of the classes.
6. Permission for leave for any particular hour of class may be obtained from the teacher who engages the class for the hour.
7. Students who come to class after the roll call will be marked *absent*.

EXAMINATION SYSTEM

Semester Examinations will be held twice in a year. Odd semester examinations will be held in November and even semester examinations in April / May.

The medium of instruction, examination and project – reporting will be English, except in the case of language courses.

The maximum permitted period of study for completing a programme of N year duration will be N+2 years. In extra ordinary cases, extension may be provided by the authorities of the institute on genuine grounds. However, scholarships / stipends will be available only as per the regulations governing the relevant schemes/programmes of the awarding agency.

The undergraduate degree should be of either a three- or four-year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications.

A. Registration

1. Candidates, while filling in the Registration Card / Examination Application form have to enter their names with correct initial(s) and spelling in Capital Letters as given in the Higher Secondary Course Certificate (HSCC). **The spelling found in the Registration Card alone will be given in all Statements of Grades / Provisional Certificate / Degree / Diploma etc.**

2. Online Registration of courses within two weeks from the date of commencement of semester should be done by the students.

B. EXAMINATION

1. Types of Assessment

Assessment of the students' attainment will be two-fold, consisting of Continuous Formative Assessment (CFA) and End Semester Examination (ESE).

The ratio for CFA and ESE will be as follows:

- (i) 40:60 for theory courses
- (ii) 60:40 for practical courses

The passing minimum will be 40% for UG programmes and 50% for the PG & Diploma in Textile Technology and Diploma in Agriculture programmes. For B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture and B.Tech., BBA, MCA, MBA and M.Tech. programmes the passing minimum and award of grades will be as per the requirements of agencies like ICAR and AICTE. Similarly for the B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes it will be as per NCTE norms.

2. Continuous Formative Assessment (CFA)

For each semester two CFAs will be conducted. First CFA will be conducted from the 40th working day of a semester while the second CFA will be conducted from the 82nd working day of the semester.

The distribution of marks for the two CFAs shall be as follows:

Continuous Formative Assessment (CFA -I & II) test shall be conducted by the department / School/Centre concerned for 1 hour 30 minutes and in OBE pattern across all programmes for 40 marks. Later, it will be reduced as per the distribution of marks for CFA I & II.

3. Substitution Tests

Substitution tests will be permitted for absentees only on production of medical certificates or on other valid grounds. The course teacher, Guru and Head will decide on the genuineness of the demand for substitution tests.

4. Supplementary CFA Tests

- Candidates who do not score the passing minimum in CFA have to take supplementary CFA tests in the subsequent semesters for which the students have to register for supplementary CFA tests in each course through a prescribed application form.
- The supplementary CFA has to be conducted by the Department/School/Centre for entire syllabus for 40 marks with a duration of 1 hour 30 minutes as per OBE pattern across all programmes.
- Examination fee for supplementary CFA courses has to be remitted into Registrar's Account No.10000 at Canara Bank, GRI Branch, Gandhigram.

5. End Semester Examination (ESE)

1. Notification regarding ESE will be announced through student portal. The student has to download the application form and submit the filled-in application form to the Controller of Examination through the HOD concerned before the specified period.
2. Examination fee for supplementary courses must be remitted through student portal into Registrar's Account No.10000 at Canara Bank, GRI Branch, Gandhigram.
3. Failed candidates who appealed against the results should also pay the fee for supplementary examinations in those papers without waiting for the appeal results.
4. Private candidates who have left the University after the completion of their programme shall also remit examination and other fees either in Canara Bank, GRI Branch, Gandhigram or send the same by Demand Draft favouring 'The Registrar, Gandhigram Rural Institute' either on Canara Bank payable at Gandhigram (Bank Code No.8500) or on State Bank of India payable at Ambathurai (Bank Code No.3373).

5. Incomplete applications, applications not accompanied by Canara Bank challan or Demand Draft and applications received after the due date will be summarily rejected.

C. ATTENDANCE

1. A student must earn a minimum attendance of 80% for theory papers and 90% for practical papers to become eligible to take the ESE in a course. However, condonation of shortage of attendance will be granted on genuine grounds up to a maximum of 10%. Condonation can be done only for students with 70% or more attendance. For this purpose, the student must, immediately upon returning to class after the period of absence, apply for the condonation, through his/her guru to the HoD of the parent department within 3 days of his/her rejoining. The recommendations made by the Course teacher and Guru will be processed by the Head of the Department. Based on the recommendations, the HoD will decide upon the application for condonation of shortage of attendance.

2. The students who secure 60-69% attendance shall be permitted to appear for the ESE in the subsequent semesters, treating the course as supplementary. Students with less than 60% shall “redo” the course by attending classes after completing the minimum duration prescribed for the programme concerned.

D. REDOING OF THE COURSES

1. A student who is debarred from the ESE for lack of attendance (<60%) must redo the course in a later semester after completing the programme. The student has to pay the prescribed additional fees for the same.

2. No student will be permitted to redo a course or reappear for a CFA test or ESE for improvement of Grade Points.

3. Students can “redo” the courses(s) after getting prior official permission for the same by applying to the Registrar through the HoD on or before the last date notified.

E. HALL TICKETS

1. The students can download the Hall Ticket with Time schedule for the End Semester Examinations (ESE) through the student portal. The ESE time schedule for all programme will be updated in the Institute website.
2. Along with the Hall Ticket, the student has to produce the identity card issued by the Institute at the time of verification by the Hall Invigilators.
3. Private Candidate can also download the Hall Ticket for the End Semester Examinations (ESE) through the student portal. They have to produce any one of the identity card issued by the Government of India at the time of verification by the Hall Invigilators.
4. The candidate will not be permitted to appear for the examinations without identity card and Hall Ticket.

F. MALPRACTICE

1. Mobile Phones, Programmable Calculators, smart watches and other electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited inside the Examination Hall. They will be confiscated, if the candidates are found possessing the same inside the Examination Hall and will not be returned.
2. No candidate shall resort to any malpractice like copying during the Examinations.
3. In case anyone is found copying, his/her answer papers will be seized and the candidate will be sent out. His/her Hall Ticket will also be seized. He/she cannot appear for subsequent examinations in that semester.
4. Malpractice cases will be referred to the Discipline Committee (Examinations) and the punishment given on the basis of the recommendation of the Discipline Committee shall be final.

5. Punishment for malpractice varies from debarring a candidate from appearing for examinations for any number of semesters, in addition to failing the candidate in that particular course or in all the courses of the semester, to expulsion of the candidate from the Institute.

G. RESULTS

1. Results of semester examinations will normally be published within 15 days after the completion of all the examinations in a given semester. The students can see their results in the student portal.

2. Statements of Grades will be sent to the Heads of the Departments within 15 days from the date of publication of the results.

3. Any discrepancy found in the Statement of Grades should be brought to the notice of the Controller of Examinations within 5 working days from the date of receipt at the office of the HoD / Dean Concerned.

4. The Institute reserves the right to withhold the result(s) in case of disciplinary proceedings and extraordinary circumstances.

5. Special Supplementary Examinations (CFA and ESE) shall be conducted during July every year for the outgoing students who have failed in only one course in order to enable them to secure their degrees.

H. TRANSPARENCY

The Student can go through the answer scripts by remitting Rs.300/- per course and to access the answer scripts with the photocopy of that answer script along with the scoring sheets showing their scores alone have to remit Rs.500/- per course.

I. APPEAL AGAINST ESE SCORES/RESULT

1. Students interested in appealing against their ESE scores/result in which there is only a single valuation, may appeal within three

working days of publications of results, through the student portal for revaluation of their ESE scores in the format prescribed after paying the prescribed fee of Rs.300/- per course. Separate notification will be circulated by Controller of Examinations through Intra mail.

2. The student of all programmes can appeal with any of their marks secured in the ESE.
3. Marks awarded after revaluation will be final.

J. GRADING

1. Grading in a course will be on the basis of the consolidated score of CFA and ESE.
2. Grade will be awarded for a course only if a candidate passes all the theory/practical components of CFA and ESE of that course.
3. The marks scored by the students will be converted into Grades (G) and Grade Points (GP).
4. For Grading pattern, calculation of Grade Point Average, (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point average (CGPA) refer Examination Manual given in the Institute website.

K. CERTIFICATES

Each student completing the programme successfully will be issued with a consolidated Statement of Grade and a Provisional Certificate along with final semester grade statement.

L. MEDALS & AWARDS

1. Medals will be awarded only for the Students of regular programmes, securing the highest mark in the aggregate, but not less than CGPA of 6.00 for Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences and CGPA of 7.00 for Science and Engineering programmes.
2. Gold medals will be given only to the First rank holders of each discipline as per the institute rules.

3. Only those who have passed all their major and allied subjects in the first attempt are eligible for the award/Gold Medals

4. Gold Medals shall be awarded only to the students who secure the highest CGPA in their respective programmes of study, provided that the student strength in the programme is not less than 10, as stipulated in the Institute's Bye-laws.

5. In case of tie in CGPA highest total marks in Part III will be considered.

M. RANK CERTIFICATE

The Controller of Examinations (CoE) shall issue Rank Certificate to those students who have successfully completed their programmes. The ranks shall be decided based on the descending order of CGPA secured by the students of the respective batch of individual programmes. Only those who have passed all the Courses in the respective semester are eligible for the rank certificate.

In case of tie in CGPA, highest total marks in Part III will be considered for giving rank certificate.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The Library shall be kept open from 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. on all working days. On Saturday 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. and on Sundays 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. During vacation it shall be kept open from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.
2. Users should register their attendance in the biometric attendance system kept in the entrance.
3. Silence shall be strictly observed in the Library.
4. Readers should not write upon, damage or mark any book, manuscript or map belonging to the Library.
5. No tracing or mechanical reproduction shall be done without prior permission from the Librarian.
6. Readers shall be responsible for any damage done to the books or other properties belonging to the library and shall be required to replace such books or other properties damaged or pay the value thereof. If one book of a set is damaged, the whole set shall have to be replaced.
7. Readers should leave the books consulted by them on the readers' table or desk.
8. Sticks, umbrellas, files, boxes and other articles shall be left at the counter at the entrance.
9. Readers will be allowed to take only loose sheets of paper with them inside the library for purposes of making notes.
10. A book will be given on loan to a member only on the presentation of his/her valid smart card at the counter. A user may borrow book through kiosk system by using biometric system and return the book at the book drop box which is kept for the purpose.
11. All books on loan must be returned on or before the due date.
12. If a book is not returned on due date, an overdue charge of 50 paise per day shall be levied.
13. When any overdue or other charge is outstanding for a member he / she will not be allowed to borrow books or withdraw his/her

deposit until he/she has paid the amount due to them.

14. Books may be renewed for a further period of one fortnight on the following conditions:
 - i. The renewal application must reach the Librarian not later than three days but not more than six clear days before the date on which the books are due.
 - ii. If another reader has applied for the book, the Librarian shall inform the member to that effect and the member shall return the book on the due date or on such extended dates as may be allowed by the Librarian.
 - iii. Not more than three consecutive renewals will be allowed on the same book without its being produced in the library for inspection.
15. A member who wishes to withdraw his/her Library deposit should give a written request a week in advance. No deposit will be repaid until all the books outstanding against the member cleared.
16. Before leaving the counter, the member must satisfy himself/herself as to whether book lent to him is in good condition.
17. Upon any infringement of the rules, the readers' privilege of admission to and borrowing books from the library will lapse.
18. Cases of incivility in the library towards anybody and failure in service by the staff may be reported immediately to the Librarian or in his absence, to the senior member of the staff present.
19. Misuse of library facilities is an offence and calls for punishment as decided by the competent authority.

GRI Research Fellowship (GRI-RF), with a stipend of Rs. 8,000/- per month, will be provided to full-time Ph.D. scholars, subject to the condition that they are not receiving any other fellowship from any funding agency.
