It began offering a Diploma in Social Science in 1957, which continued until 1963. In 1994, it launched the country's first specialization in "Welfare of the Marginalized." The "Human Rights" specialization was added in 2003-2004. Its vision is the formation of social work professionals committed to a just and equitable society. ABOUT GANDHIGRAM RURAL INSTITUTE (GRI)

Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI), established in 1956 by Dr.G.Ramachandran and Dr.T.S. Soundaram Ramachandran, is inspired by Mahatma Gandhi's NaiTalim philosophy, which blends practical skills with cognitive learning and emphasizes value-based education rooted in indigenous culture. Influenced by the Radhakrishnan Education Commission and global models like Denmark's Folks Hoschkole, the US Land-Grant system, and Tagore's Sriniketan Experiment, GRI focuses on rural development. Administered by India's Ministry of Education and funded by the UGC, GRI offers programs in rural development, sciences, engineering, agriculture, and economics. Combining teaching, research, and extension, it addresses rural challenges effectively. With 8 schools, 19 departments, and 9 centers serving about 4,000 students, GRI earned deemed university status in 1976. It has received multiple NAAC accreditations, including five-star status in 2002 and an 'A' grade in its 2010 and 2016 reaccreditations, showcasing its commitment to academic excellence and Gandhian values.
