1. Preamble

Gandhigram was founded in 1947 by a team of dedicated Gandhians led by Dr.T.S.Soundram and Dr.G.Ramachandran. The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI), one of the premier Rural Institutes under Ministry of Education, Government of India was started in 1956. It attained the status of a Deemed to be University in 1976 and the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) conferred FIVESTAR status on GRI in 2002. The Institute was reaccredited by NAAC with “A” Grade in 2010 (2nd cycle) , 2016 (3rd cycle) and NAAC A++ (4th cycle) in 2025. The Institute is governed by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, New Delhi.

6. Implementation of National Education Policy

As per the instructions of the Ministry of Education, Government of India and the University Grants Commission, the National Education Policy 2020 is implemented in GRI from the academic year 2024-25. The undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options. For example, a Certificate will be awarded after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas or a Diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor's degree after a 3-year programme and Honours Degree on successful completion of the 4-years. Similarly a student who has completed 'n' year programme can re-enter the Institute at the (NP¹)th year and continue the programme. For example, a student who left the programme at the end of the first year can join the 2nd year of the programme at a later date.

In the Five Year Integrated PG also, in addition to the above, there is a provision for the students to leave at the end of the third year with a UG degree or to leave at the end of the fourth year with UG (Hons) degree or at the end of the fifth year with an Integrated PG degree.

14. Admission of Foreign Students

Foreign applicants should produce a valid student visa (research visa in case of Ph.D. Programmes), medical fitness certificate as per the norms of the Government of India

and a certificate of financial guarantee at the time of admission. If admitted, they will be governed by such rules and regulations as may be framed by the Government of India and by the authorities of GRI from time to time. Students from SAARC countries such as Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and developing countries such as Kenya, Rwanda, Sudan, and Nigeria can pay the fee and caution deposit on par with Indian students. This will not be applicable to fellowship holders of these countries. In the case of other foreign students, the fee will be four times that of Indian students and caution deposit will be Rs.10,000/- all payable in **US dollars**. 16. Submission of Application

Applications to UG/PG programmes (except Certificate, Diploma, PG Diploma, B.Voc. programmes) will be through NTA-Common University Entrance Test (CUET-(UG/PG) 2026 and for ITEP B.Sc.B.Ed programme will be through NTA-NCET 2026. In case of availability of seats after filling through CUET, the Institute will fill up the unfilled UG seats on the basis of +2 marks in Part-III subjects and unfilled PG seats through an entrance test conducted by the Institute, in accordance with the Government of India's reservation policy. The unfilled seats of UG/PG programmes (if any) will be made available after filling of seats through CUET (UG/PG)-2026.

For Diploma, Post Graduate Diploma, and B.Voc. programmes separate applications are to be submitted by online. (For details visit www.ruraluniv.ac.in).

For admission to Ph.D. programmes, a separate notification will be issued.

Applications are to be submitted only by online. The applicants can visit our website ***www.ruraluniv.ac.in*** for prospectus and instructions for submitting the online applications. The candidates are advised to read carefully and follow the instructions given in this prospectus. Before applying for admission, the candidates are advised to ensure eligibility as per the criteria laid down for each programme of study. Before submission of online application, the candidates should register for admission enabling generation of username and password which will be sent through email and SMS to the candidates. At the time of online registration the following details should be furnished.

- Name followed by initials
- (as per the Higher Secondary mark statement)
- Date of birth
- Valid email-ID
- Mobile number

It may be noted that the details such as Date of birth, email ID and mobile number cannot be changed after registration.

After successful online registration, the candidates can access their login in the portal and proceed to fill up the application form. The applicants are required to make the payment through Debit Card/Credit Card/Net Banking. 20. Conditions for Admission

Only provisional admission will be given, subject to verification of the original certificates. Candidates admitted to PG Programmes must produce the consolidated statement of marks of the qualifying examination on or **before 30th September, 2026**, failing which their provisional admission stands cancelled.

21. Reservation and Relaxation

Admission to all programmes will be made subject to the reservation policy of the Government of India / UGC Norms. The SC/ST applicants will be granted relaxation in admission as mentioned elsewhere in this prospectus. Seats also will be reserved for certain special categories namely EWS, Differently abled, Wards of Defense Personnel, Sports Persons and candidates hailing from North Eastern Regions, Jammu & Kashmir and PM cares Children scheme for supporting children who have lost both the parents or legal guardians or adopted parents or surviving parent due to COVID-19 pandemic during the period starting 11th March 2020 to 5th May 2023.

Eligibility under Differently abled Quota for School of Agriculture and Animal Sciences as per ICAR norms:

The differently abled candidates with only lower limb disability (locomotor disability) alone are eligible under this quota. The disability percentage for lower limb (locomotor disability) ranging from 40% to 60% shall alone be considered eligible. Candidates with less than 40% disabilities shall only be considered under their respective communal category. Though a differently abled applicant has lower limb disability (locomotor disability) with the admissible range of 40% - 60% if the disability-associated factors (with or without any other disability) affect the applicant's study and increase the life risk to the candidate, his/her application shall not be considered for admission.

Candidates seeking admission against this reservation set apart for Orthopedically differently abled (lower limb disability – disability percentage range: 40% to 60%)

should produce the certificate issued by the District Medical Board concerned certifying the nature and extent of disability in percentage. Certificates obtained from an individual Doctor will not be considered.

22. Choice-Based Credit System

All the undergraduate and the postgraduate programmes of the Institute will be offered under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as prescribed by the University Grants Commission. The CBCS guidelines framed by the Institute can be viewed in the Institute website.
